Young or old, classical music lover or first timer to Suntory Hall—we have a variety of concerts and participatory programmes for all to enjoy.

Main Hall

Suntory Hall opened in 1986 as Tokyo's first dedicated concert hall, with the concept of 'In pursuit of the world's most beautiful sound'. The Main Hall is specially noted for its superior acoustics and was the first concert hall in Japan to adopt the vineyard style, which Herbert von Karajan keenly advocated. In this style, seating surrounds the stage in terraced rows, allowing the musicians and audience members to share a common, immersive musical experience.

The lower floor can also be accessed directly from the West Entrance next to the Box Office ticket booth. To ascend to the upper floor, please use the lift through the West Entrance. Restrooms for wheelchair users and ostomates are also available.
- Smoking is not allowed in the hall. Smoking room is designated in the neighbouring premises. Please ask the staff members for details.
